## International A Level Accounting

# International A Level: Economics and Law

## International A Level Economics

There are two examination papers for the IAS, and two further to achieve the IAL.

Onscreen assessment will be available for this qualification from 2026 as an alternative assessment format.

- Business Behaviour
- Developments in the global economy

## International A Level Law

### Why choose this qualification?

Students who successfully study for this qualification will have a good knowledge and understanding of the principles, concepts and techniques of English law. This qualification lays a secure foundation for further study. In addition, it provides a worthwhile course for students who will end their study at the IAL stage.

The IAL in Law is a linear qualification, consisting of two compulsory externally-examined papers that must be completed in the same examination series. There is no AS Level for Law.

## International A Level Biology

The content is relevant for students who have achieved a GCSE in Biology and who want to study this subject at a higher level. Problems require the application of mathematical skills. Core practical activities are embedded throughout the course, allowing students to link theoretical knowledge and understanding to practical scenarios.

There are three examination papers for the IAS, and three further to achieve the IAL.

- Molecules, Diet, Transport and Health
- Cells, Development, Biodiversity and Conservation
- Energy, Environment, Microbiology and Immunity
- Respiration, Internal Environment, Coordination and Gene Technology
- Practical Skills

## International A Level Chemistry

### Why choose this qualification?

The content is relevant for students who have achieved a GCSE in Chemistry and who want to study this subject at a higher level. Learners will develop knowledge and understanding of their subject by applying the concepts in the specifications to a range of different problems, set in a variety of contexts.

Problems require the application of mathematical skills. Core practical activities are embedded throughout the course, allowing students to link theoretical knowledge and understanding to practical scenarios.

There are three examination papers for the IAS, and three further to achieve the IAL.

# International A Level: Sciences & Psychology

## International A Level Physics

### Why choose this qualification?

Learners will develop knowledge and understanding of their subject by applying the concepts in the specifications to a range of different problems, set in a variety of contexts.

Problems require the application of mathematical skills. Core practical activities are embedded throughout the course, allowing students to link theoretical knowledge and understanding to practical scenarios.

There are three examination papers for the IAS, and three further to achieve the IAL.

- Waves and Electricity

## International A Level Psychology

### Why choose this qualification?

Students will develop a critical perspective on psychology by analysing the way psychological theory and research can be critically evaluated. They will also develop the ability to work autonomously, and learn how to engage with others to discuss and debate psychological explanations of human behaviour and the issues surrounding the use of psychology within society.

There are two examination papers for the IAS, and two further to achieve the IAL.

### What will you study?

- Social and cognitive psychology
- Biological psychology, learning theories and development
- Applications of psychology
- Clinical psychology and psychological skills



# International A Level: English

## International A Level English Language

### Why choose this qualification?

Students will study English Language in a global context, including the influence of other languages on the development of English.

There are two examination papers for the IAS, and two further to achieve the IAL.

Onscreen assessment is available for this qualification as an alternative assessment format.

- Investigating Language

## International A Level English Literature

### Why choose this qualification?

Students will study works from a selection including Dickens, Bronte and Shakespeare, pre-1900 poetry as well as post-2000 poetry and prose, together with a range of texts with a wide international appeal, including *The Kite Runner* and *White Tiger*.

There are two examination papers for the IAS, and two further to achieve the IAL.

Onscreen assessment is available for this qualification as an alternative assessment format.

#### What will you study?

- Post-2000 Poetry and Prose
- Drama
- Poetry and Prose
- Shakespeare and Pre-1900 Poetry

# International A Level: Maths

## International A Level Mathematics, Further Mathematics, Pure Mathematics

### Why choose this qualification?

There are three different International AS/A Level awards available, Mathematics, Further Mathematics and Pure Mathematics.

Students study a variety of units, following pathways to their desired qualification. There are three examination papers for each IAS, and three further to achieve each IAL.

Students will develop responsibility for their own learning and mathematical development. They will use their knowledge and skills to apply mathematics to real-life situations, solve unstructured problems and use mathematics as an effective means of communication.

# International A Level: Information Technology and Computer Science

## International A Level Information Technology

### Why choose this qualification?

Students will engage with web and database design in a practical, externally-assessed examination, discover how to plan and implement an IT project, and learn about key areas such as emerging technologies, the online environment and systems analysis and design.

There are two examination papers for the IAS, and two further to achieve the IAL.

### What will you study?

- IT systems
- Coding for the web
- Relational databases

## International A Level Computer Science

### Why choose this qualification?

This is a completely new qualification, for first teaching from September 2026. It combines the fundamental principles and concepts of computer science with exciting and topical content for academic and workplace success.

First assessment will be from May/June 2027 for the IAS and May/June 2028 for the IAL.

# International A Level: Humanities

## International A Level Geography

### Why choose this qualification?

This qualification enables students to develop their knowledge of locations, places, processes and environments, at all geographical scales from local to global. They will also develop independent thinking and critical thinking skills.

There are two examination papers for the IAS, and two further to achieve the IAL.

- Global Challenges
- Geographical Investigations
- Contested Planet
- Researching Geography

## International A Level History

### Why choose this qualification?

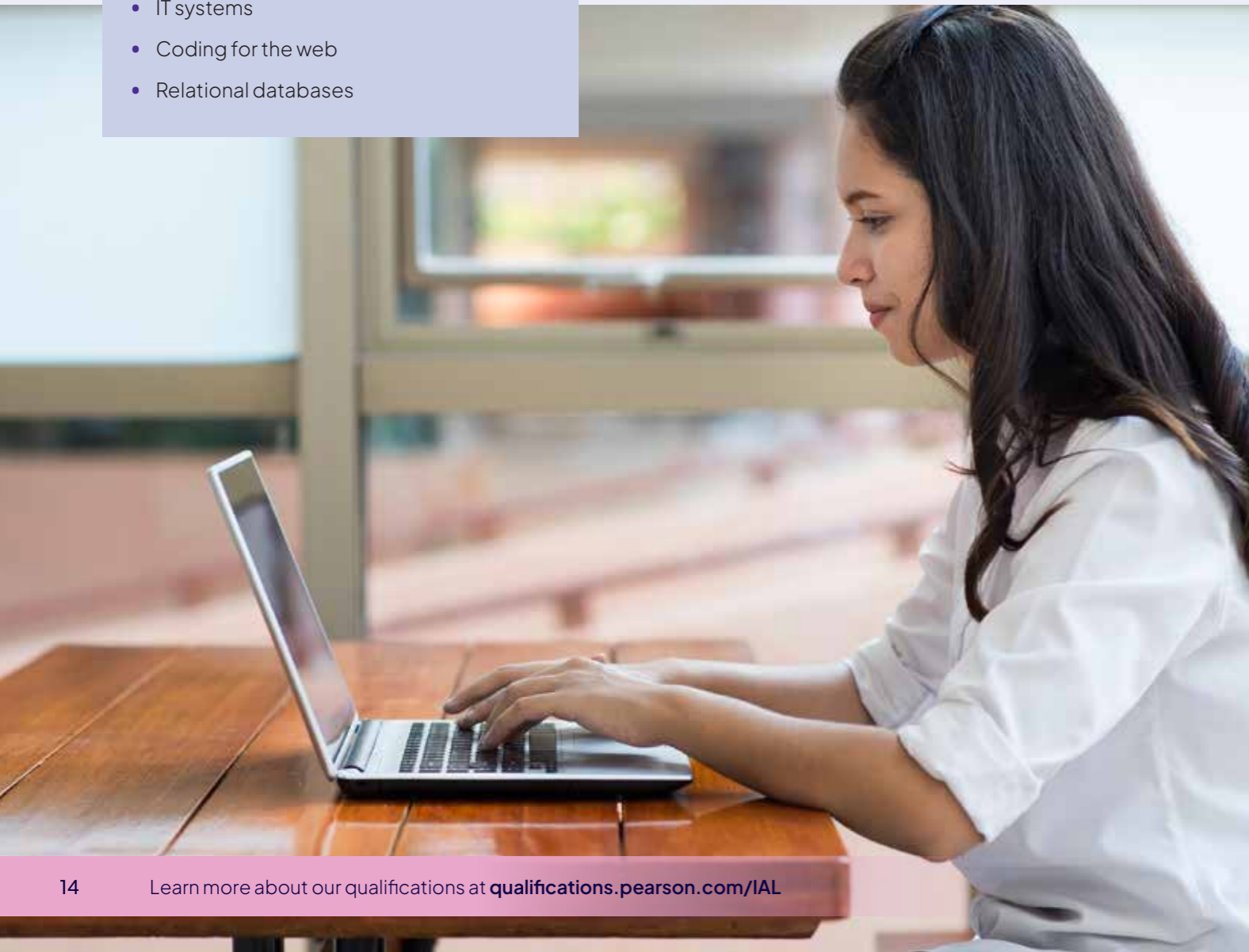
Learners will develop their interest and enthusiasm for history and understand its intrinsic value and significance. They will gain the ability to critically evaluate past events, construct an argument and work in a team. The qualification focuses on both breadth and depth of history.

There are two examination papers for the IAS, and two further to achieve the IAL.

Onscreen assessment will be available for this qualification from 2026 as an alternative assessment format.

### What will you study?

- Depth Study with Interpretations
- Breadth Study with Source Evaluation
- Thematic Study with Source Evaluation
- International Study with Historical Interpretations



# International A Level: Languages

## International A Level French, German, Spanish

### Why choose this qualification?

Our International AS/A Levels in French, German and Spanish are relevant and engaging to students, including topics such as lifestyle, travel, education, and technology. As well as developing language skills, students will gain knowledge and understanding of native-speaking cultures.

Achievement in this qualification is benchmarked against the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, commonly used by higher education institutions and future employers to indicate an individual's ability.

There are two examinations for each IAS, and two further to achieve each IAL. Each level has a spoken assessment as well as a written paper that assesses listening, reading and writing.

### What will you study?

- Spoken expression and response
- Understanding and written response
- Understanding and spoken response
- Research, understanding and written response

## International A Level Arabic, Greek

### Why choose this qualification?

Our International AS/A Levels in Arabic and Greek are for students who are studying the language in order to enhance their future educational or employment prospects. Contexts and settings will be those that students are likely to encounter, such as school and the media. Culturally sensitive and authentic reading texts are used throughout.

Achievement in this qualification is benchmarked against the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, commonly used by higher education institutions and future employers to indicate an individual's ability.

There is one examination paper for each IAS, and one further to achieve each IAL. Speaking and listening skills are not directly assessed but will be developed by studying these qualifications.

- Understanding and Written Response
- Writing and Research

# Pearson Edexcel Extended Level 3 Project Qualification (EPQ)

## Stand out from the crowd

To give your child the edge when applying for university, they can choose the Pearson Edexcel Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), an optional, standalone qualification, taken alongside core International A Level subjects.

The EPQ develops the independent learning and research skills demanded by universities and employers.

It gives students the opportunity to:

- Explore an area that interests them, aligned to an area of the curriculum or a hobby or interest.
- Research a subject that might not be available through other qualifications, whilst developing valuable independent research and project management skills.
- Become future-ready by developing transferable skills valued by universities and employers.
- Earn additional UCAS points (up to 28 points for an A\*, the equivalent of an International AS Level) which makes university applications stand out.

## How does it work?

Teachers work with students to agree the suitable project topic/area of interest. The teacher provides guidance on planning and research activities. The key objective is for students to develop their independent research skills and then apply what they've learnt in the creation of an original piece of work, which could be a dissertation, an investigation, a performance or an artefact.
